
## Junior Infants Suggested Work

Suggested Priority Learning:

English	Phonics:         Revision of Z, W, V, NG, OO OO (see parent notes for suggested multi-sensory approach). Listen to the song and the story on the Jolly Phonics app. Practice tracing the letters on different surfaces and play a game of Odd One Out.         How to Play Odd One Out:         The adult says a list of words with the target sound, the child claps each time they hear the target sound and make an X with their hands when they hear a word that does not have the target sound. For example, <i>zebra, zoo, flower, zipper</i> - the child must make an X instead of clapping when they hear the word flower.         Reading:         Fiction Reader 5 - Ella in Africa (also available on Gill Explore under Unit 5). Read through the book with your child, 2-4 pages a day. There
	<ul> <li>is also a non-fiction reader called 'Africa' available on Gill Explore under unit 5, this story has an audiobook option that the children might like to listen to :)</li> <li>Writing:</li> <li>Finish the orange pattern copy if your child has not already done so.</li> <li>Please encourage children to trace the pattern with their finger on the table, on their hand, in the air and in their copy before attempting with their pencil.</li> </ul>

SESE	Story: This week we will be looking at the story Day Monkey, Night Monkey

<ul> <li>by Julia Donaldson. This story compares and contrasts the 2 monkeys experiences of daytime and nighttime.</li> <li>Reading activities <ul> <li>Discuss the language used eg "Daft" is a word used in this book. It means silly or foolish. "Tea" is a word used in this book. It means supper or an evening meal.</li> <li>The first half of the book takes place at night. Ask your child to point to things that tell us it is night.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Language activities <ul> <li>The monkeys do different things at night than during the day. Talk to your child about their own day time routine. What happens at night?</li> <li>Talk about people who have to work at night and why. Examples: doctors, snow plough drivers, truck drivers, nurses,</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
bakers, firemen, policemen, ambulance drivers.

Activity:
Creating monkey finger puppets.
Monkey Finger Puppet

Science:
Exploring the forces of pushing and pulling. Children are asked to conduct experiments involving the forces pushing and pulling.
<u>Pulling:</u> We will be looking at how gravity pulls objects down towards the earth through play experiments. First create a ramp by stacking books, lego or other items. Allow a toy car to go down the ramp onto a smooth surface such as a wooden floor and measure how far it goes. Alter the height of the ramp and repeat the experiment.

	Does the car go further if the ramp is higher or lower? Discuss the results with your child. The higher the ramp, the stronger the pull of gravity and the further the car will go. Pushing: In this experiment the children will need one ramp and toy car. This time we will experiment with how surfaces change how far the car can go. Place the car on the ramp and allow it to go down. Measure how far it goes. Change the experiment by putting the car and ramp on different surfaces such as carpet, grass, a blanket. Does it go as far or further if the car is on tiles, wood, carpet, a blanket, grass? Discuss why the surface under the car affects the results. The car experiences friction when a surface is not smooth causing it to slow down. When there is no friction the car can go further. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yuvkaeMUT50</u>
